I gave our foster boy his quilt and read the letter to him when he came from school today and he was absolutely chuffed with it.

When I showed him the homemade quilt and explained to him that someone had made it just for him, I think he was really quite taken aback that someone had done this just for him. He gave me a huge hug for arranging this for him, which is really for the person who made it.

He is very keen to say thank you to the person who made it and he couldn't wait to use it at bedtime. We talked about how he could use it as a bed cover, snuggle blanket or even take it with him when we go on long car journeys.

Thank you so much - the quilts make such a difference to these children in foster care who have generally had a pretty rubbish start in life. I know our foster boy will treasure his for a long time.

Deborah says:

My partner and I have been foster carers since October 2014 and we immediately set out to see how we could raise money doing something we love to support The Fostering Network.

I'm a keen horse rider and I've organised three sponsored walk or horse rides so far in Ashdown Forest with up to 200 horses taking part in one of our three different length courses and I raised more than I ever thought I could!

Everyone (including the horses!) were encouraged to dress up in orange and we gave out certificates and medals at the end. We had a food van on standby at the finish too so the hungry participants could buy some well-

deserved food. I would encourage anyone to get involved and sign up to a challenge or organise one that other people can take part in good luck!

Niki says:

I wanted to fundraise for a charity that supported children and young people which is why I chose The Fostering Network. I believe that every child deserves a loving family and even though these children have had a hard and unsettling start in life they deserve the same life opportunities as their peers, including stable and lasting relationships, educational achievement and a positive experience of family life.

I decided to take on a challenge I hadn't done before and do a sky dive. My mum and sister wanted to take part too, so all three of us took to the skies over Suffolk and completed our first ever 13,000ft freefall! The rain stopped long enough for us to complete the jump and we raised over our target of £1,400 for The Fostering Network so it was well worth it. Despite the screams as we jumped out, we'd all sign up to do another one.





A Foster Walk is a fantastic way to get your friends, family, and colleagues together to have a fun day and to raise funds for our vital work supporting those involved in fostering.




The Fostering Network organises Foster Walk in cities across the UK, but you can also organise one of your own locally at any time of year. Whether you're an individual, a fostering service, a local authority, a family or a group of friends, you can arrange a Foster Walk in your local community.

Top tips on running your own Foster Walk

- Start by downloading the Foster Walk pack thefosteringnetwork.org.uk/ foster-walk.
- Pick a route for your walk. Choose a family friendly route - fostering is all about families and we love events where all the family can take part.

- If you fancy doing something a bit different you could choose a themed or seasonal walk and finish in a local café or park.
- Tell people about your walk! Spread the word through word of mouth, posters in local schools, community notice boards and use social media to increase the awareness of your event.
- Encourage participants to create an online giving page such as Virgin Money Giving.
- Request a batch of sponsorship forms to hand out to everyone who signs up so they can kick-start their own fundraising!

Fundraise online

It's quick, easy and costs nothing!

Digital fundraising is everywhere and there's lots of simple ways that you can make a difference just by going about your normal online shopping and social media. All of these options take a few minutes to sign up to and then they do the rest of the work for you.


The Giving Machine

The Giving Machine works by generating commissions through online shopping (retailers include Amazon, John Lewis, Skyscanner, Sainsbury's and Next). They convert the commissions in to donations for your chosen cause at no extra cost to you.



- Sign up as a 'Giver' for free (thegivingmachine.co.uk) and choose The Fostering Network as your charity to support.
- · Install the 'shopping reminder' via Google Chrome this small piece of software sits on your device.
- Go about your online shopping as normal! The Giving Machine will pop up to let you know which websites you're generating a donation on bonus!
- You can download The Giving Machine software to your laptop, tablet or desktop or download the app for phones and tablets.

- · Scroll to the bottom of your Facebook Page and find the 'Create' heading on the left.
- · Click the 'fundraiser' link and create your fundraiser.
- Once you've created your fundraiser you can publish it on your Facebook and anyone
 who clicks on The Fostering Network's profile on Facebook will be able to see your
 fundraiser and donate if they want.

25 ways to fundraise!

Absolutely anything you enjoy can be made in to a fundraiser! We've listed 25 ideas below to start you off, but really the list is endless...





Ideal for the sporty side of you:

- Running/walking/trekking challenge
- 2. Cycling challenge (static bikes work too!)
- 3. Skydive
- 4. Obstacle course (Tough Mudder for example)
- 5. Swimming challenge
- 6. Golf day
- 7. Group hike/trek/walk/ramble
- 8. Sports tournament (football, cricket, rugby)



Ideal for bringing people together:

- 9. Group challenge (obstacle course, relay run)
- 10. Dress down at work/school day
- 11. Family fun day event
- 12. Carols by Candlelight
- 13. Themed party (Eurovision, Halloween, Christmas)
- 14. The Big Night In films, spa treatments,
- 15. Ask your local if you can host a pub quiz



Ideal for fundraising with food:

- 16. BBO
- 17. Wine tasting evening
- 18. Coffee morning
- 19. Dinner party (you could pick a theme!)
- 20. Cake sale at work/school/ in your local community



Or why not try one of our miscellaneous ideas?!

- 21. Holding a raffle as part of an event already happening
- 22. Brave the shave or a sponsored waxathon
- 23. Sponsored car wash at home or work
- 24. Sponsored silence for 24 hours (it's harder than you think!)

Making your fundraising event legal, safe and fun!

Now you've decided what fundraising event you want to organise, here are a few of our top tips to make sure your event is a success.



Create your online fundraising page

If you're doing a challenge of any sort then use **Virgin Money Giving** or **Just Giving** to set up your fundraising page and share the link on social media and by text or WhatsApp too!

Social media

Use social media wherever you can to help spread the word about what you're doing and encourage people to donate. You could:

- · Create a Facebook event and invite everyone to it.
- · Share your online fundraising pages on your social media.
- · Ask your work or local community to advertise the events on their intranets or websites.
- · Use Twitter and Facebook to rally interest and awareness of your efforts.

Location, location, location

You could hold an event at home or in your local community. Picking a suitable, and if possible unique, location for your event will make all the difference to its success.

Date

Make sure you pick a date that doesn't conflict with any other local events or major sporting events.

Alcohol licence

You don't need a licence to provide alcohol at a private event, such as a street party or at home, as long as the alcohol is not being sold. If you're planning on selling alcohol, find out if you'll need to apply for a licence. It will take you about two months to apply and receive a temporary event notice.

Risk assessments

It's always a good idea to carry out a risk assessment to make sure your event is as safe as possible - don't worry it's much easier than it sounds!

A risk assessment is a careful consideration of the different elements of your event which could possibly cause harm to your guests. Risks could include trip hazards such as uneven surfaces or the weather. Get in touch with us to request a risk assessment form.

Once you've identified any risks, you'll need to consider if there are any ways you can reduce that risk such as if you're having an outside event - having somewhere to retreat if the weather changes or asking your guests to come armed with raincoats and umbrellas.



Thank you for raising money for The Fostering Network!

Now the hard work is done all you need to do is pay the money in.



Online fundraising

Anything you've raised online will come directly to The Fostering Network and the Gift Aid will have been added on where appropriate so there is no action on your part. Online giving pages close automatically three months after your event is over.

Offline fundraising

All funds collected should be sent to The Fostering Network within six weeks of collection if possible, and it's a good idea to always have two people present to count any money raised.

When you're ready to pay in your money you can:

Gift Aid

- By allowing The Fostering Network to claim gift aid on a donation, we're able to add 25p of every £1 donated.
- You must complete a **donation form** (included in this pack) or you can find one on our website. In order to claim gift aid on any donation you must provide us with your address, postcode and you must be a UK taxpayer.
- Please also use the **sponsorship forms** (included in this pack) to collect Gift Aid declarations from anyone who donates to you or your event. That way we can increase your donation by as much as 25 per cent with no extra cost to you.

They must tick the Gift Aid box if applicable in order to be eligible.
